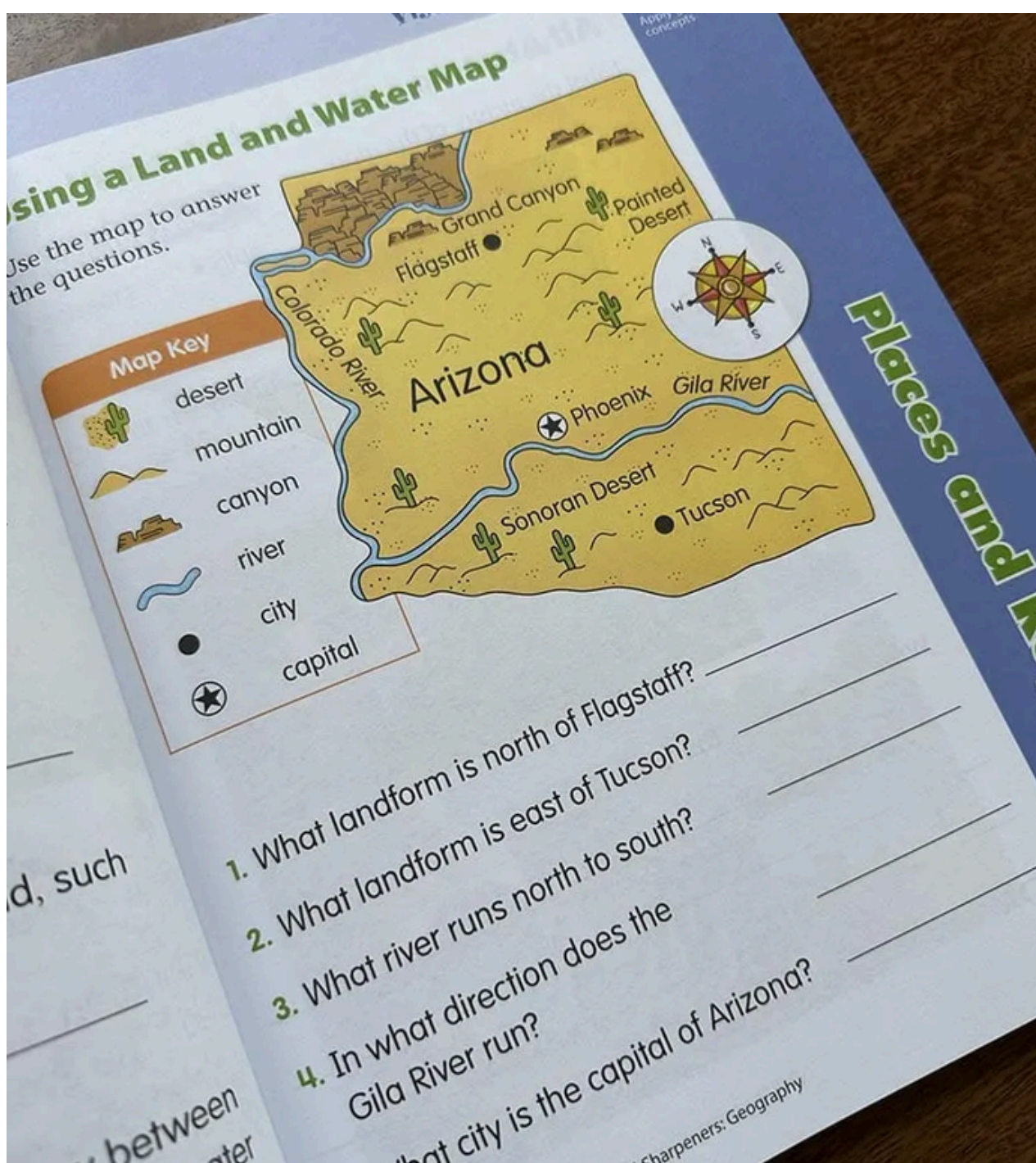
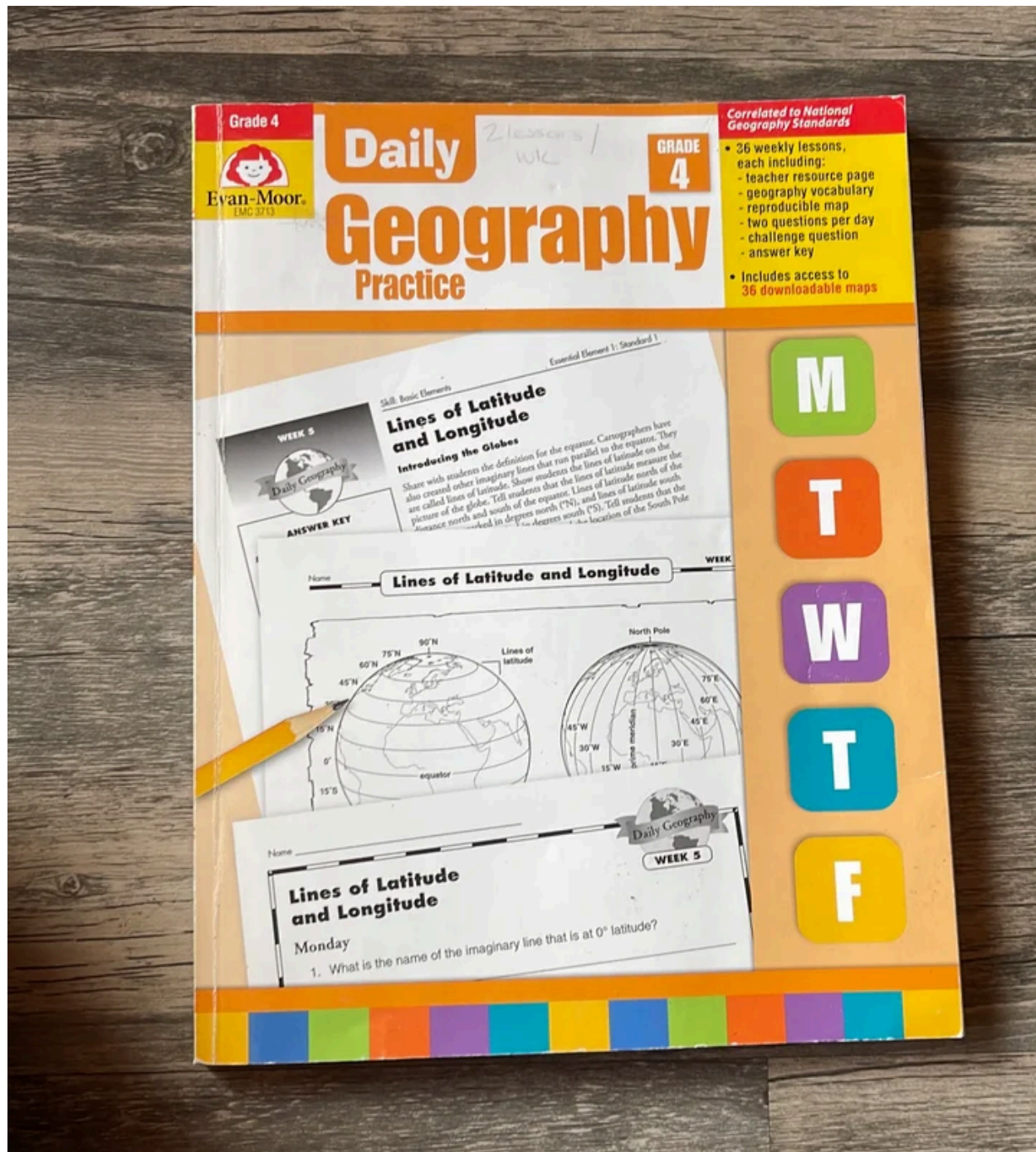
Daily Geography Practice offers a steady, bite-sized approach to geography that fits smoothly into a homeschooling rhythm. Each week, students tackle two short geography questions per day, culminating in a weekly “challenge” question. Because the format is predictable and lessons are brief, many families find it easy to include consistently—even on busy weeks. On the flip side, it’s not a deep, narrative-rich history program. If you like explorations with stories, you may want to supplement with hands-on or reading-based materials.

Curriculum Overview

- 36 weekly units per school year
- Two geography questions per day, Monday–Friday
- Difficulty ramps through the week; includes a weekly “challenge” question
- Each unit includes: teacher overview + answer key, vocabulary list, map page, question pages
- A 10-page reproducible geography glossary is included
- Aligned with National Geography Standards; supports any geography or social studies curriculum
